Bursting with color and creativity, the exhibition celebrates young artists' dreams for tomorrow — innovation, technology, and boundless possibilities.

The exhibition features artwork by 26 youth from 8 schools and organizations in the Dublin area including Dougherty Elementary School, Fallon Middle School, Happy Valley Art School, Kolb Elementary School, Kuk Sool Won of Dublin Martial Arts School, Ms. Meng's Art School, Pleasanton Harvest Park Middle School, and Wells Middle School.

This exhibition was organized by the Dublin Arts Collective (DAC) which is a nonprofit organization located in Alameda County District One, represented by David Haubert, President of the Board. DAC is dedicated to promoting and supporting visual arts through collaboration with artists, communities, and other art associations. DAC has a multifaceted approach.
